**FROM THE ER'S DESK**

The annual convention for the Florida State Elks Association (FSEA) has concluded for the fiscal year of 2008–2009. In the Ritual Competition, our team finished a most impressive second place. Congratulations to Tracey Austin for winning her second All-State Award for competing as Loyal Knight. Bob Thorburn finished second for competing as the Esquire – very impressive considering he had only been our Esquire for about six months! Ron Brown brought home the second place Coach’s plaque, and yours truly came in third in the Eleven O’clock Toast Competition. Our Lodge won several awards, as well. Tracey Austin received the award for the North District Outstanding Indoctrination Program; Ron Brown received the award for our division’s highest per-capita donations to the Harry-Anna Trust Fund; and Dorothy Brown received the award for our best Inter-Lodge Visitation Program. Congratulations to all of you who helped and participated in these programs.

Several of us attended the presentation by Edmonds Associates on Sunday morning. This is the media consulting/public affairs group that is coordinating the Florida Membership Revitalization and Retention Program. Thirty second and one minute ads will be run on our local radio stations as follows: WMAF (on frequency 1230 AM) in Madison; WGWD FM (on frequency 93.3) in Quincy; WFLA FM (on frequency 100.7 FM) in Tallahassee; and WTAL (on frequency 1450 AM) in Tallahassee. There has also been a website developed as a welcome center for prospects: [www.DiscoverFLElks.com](http://www.DiscoverFLElks.com) will educate visitors to the website on what it means to be an Elk. It will additionally provide information on joining the Elks, contains a Lodge locator, and gives the visitor the opportunity to tell us about themselves and contact us. It also generates automatic e-mailed welcome letters, allows visitors to donate to the state therapy program, and informs visitors of upcoming events. All information garnered from this website will be sent to the FSEA Campaign Headquarters, who will then distribute prospect lists to the appropriate Lodges. Working in tandem with the website, there will also be a call center. The toll free number is 1-877-554-Elks. The call center will act as first responder to prospect

There will be more information soon, and I am intrigued with the program that will be put forth on a trial basis in Florida and Washington state. For Florida, the program includes a new website (discoverflelks.com), radio spots, newspaper and periodical advertising, billboards on I-75 in the Tampa area, and local advertising on city buses in several cities.

The Elks had a peak membership in Florida in the early 1990s, and has been in decline since. Some lodges have been fortunate to grow, but most have not been so lucky. This is an opportunity for the Elks to achieve recognition, gain some new members, and strengthen the organization. The program is expected to kick off in July.

## ARMY OF HOPE PROGRAM

By the time this article appears in the May Antlers, we have already held our first organizational meeting in Tallahassee on April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Representatives from the lodges from St. Augustine to Warrington were in attendance.

Picnics to raise funds for the Army of Hope Program will be held State-wide on June 13<sup>rd</sup>. In the North District, picnics will be held in St. Augustine, Tallahassee, and Warrington.

The Army of Hope is a program of the Florida State Elks Association established in 2008. During that first year over \$65,000 was raised to provide financial assistance to those in need.

The mission of the Army of Hope is to provide aid assistance to the families of deceased, disabled, and DEPLOYED members of the military of Florida. Anyone who is on active duty in any branch of the armed forces and deployed in Iraq, Afghanistan, etc., and in need of some financial assistance, may apply to the Army of Hope for help.

Examples of aid assistance are as follows:

- School lunches
- Medical or dental emergencies (not covered by insurance)
- Minor home repairs (plumbing, painting, etc.)
- Auto repairs or transportation when needed
- Full-time or backup babysitting
- Phone cards to contact loved ones back home
- Lawn mowing, landscaping, sprinkler repairs
- A/C and major appliance repairs
- Clothing, shoes, etc.

Individual Aid Assistance Forms are available from your local Elks lodges and may be submitted back to your lodge, the District Vice-Chairman, or directly to the State Secretary. The local lodges will review the request and then submit it to the District Vice-Chairman, who will in turn submit the request for final approval to the Army of Hope Committee through the State Secretary.

Only the families of Florida active duty military personnel, military reservists, Coast Guard, National Guard and/or their dependents are eligible to apply. An active duty member stationed in Florida with his/her dependents would qualify as a Florida resident.

It is estimated that the time to process an application for assistance may take as long as four weeks. Emergency requests may be expedited at the request of a local lodge. Should you have any questions or if I can be of any assistance, please feel free to call me at 850-926-2900.
